## **Director Nancy Bui Ward Two**

Nancy Bui was elected to the SMUD Board of Directors in November 2008 to represent Ward 2. Ward 2 includes the communities of Folsom, Rancho Cordova, Rancho Murieta, Galt and Wilton.

Bui was a consultant for two of the world's largest and best-known consulting companies and now owns a small business. She is a technology and management consultant who has worked with state and local government agencies, as well as energy and health-care organizations. Bui has served as a consultant to executive-level management for some of the country's largest employers, bringing efficiency and project management to their organizations.

A resident of Rancho Cordova, she worked on the successful campaign for the community to become its own city. She has served as Rancho Cordova's representative to the Sacramento Transportation and Air Quality Collaborative, working to develop a comprehensive long-range strategy for the area to improve transportation and air quality while maintaining the region's economic viability.

Bui is also an active volunteer. She has served on the Board of Directors of Sacramento Advocates for Girls Empowerment, an organization that assists middle-school and high-school girls in pursuing careers in computer-related technology, life sciences, engineering, science, math and law. She is also a volunteer teacher for Junior Achievement, the world's largest non-profit organization dedicated to educating students about workforce readiness, entrepreneurship and financial literacy, as well as the founder of Bear HUGS (Hope You Give Someone), speaking to children about child abuse. After Hurricane Katrina, she became a certified disaster services volunteer for the SacSierra chapter of the Red Cross.
