What is the Local Hazard Mitigation Plan?

- A Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) is a five-year risk mitigation plan
- The LHMP includes an assessment of the most significant hazards SMUD plans for, including, but not limited to, flood, dam failure, wildfire, earthquake, drought, climate change, severe weather, cyber threats, and terrorism.

Benefit of LHMP

- Supports SMUD's commitment to reduce and eliminate, where possible, the potential risks and impacts of natural and human-caused hazards to SMUD's communities, systems and/or operations.
- Increased access to FEMA grants previously not available to help fund hazard mitigation efforts

- Public Review Period: August 20-September 20, 2018

- E-mail to 110 stakeholders agencies

Feedback

- Two comments during the public comment period
 - Sacramento County
 - County has focus on storms that generate high wind gusts. This is reflected in Section 5.10.5 of SMUD's draft LHMP
 - Consistent with the County's LHMP
 - City of Sacramento
 - Consistent with the City of Sacramento's LHMP
