As Managing Director, **Janet Gail Besser** oversees strategy for the SEPA Pathways – Utility Business Models, Regulatory Innovation, Grid Integration and Transportation Electrification – and leads content development and execution for Regulatory Innovation. She brings to this role broad energy industry experience as a regulator, clean energy business association leader, utility executive, developer, consultant, and consumer advocate.

Previously, she was Executive Vice President of the Northeast Clean Energy Council (NECEC), Vice President, Regulatory Strategy and Policy at National Grid, Chair and Commissioner of the Massachusetts Department of Public Utilities, where she led electric industry restructuring, and an executive and expert consultant at Analysis Group and Lexecon. She also held senior staff roles at the Massachusetts Energy Office and New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission, served as policy director for a DC-based national independent power association, and began her career as a small hydro developer and low-income consumer advocate.

Janet is a nationally recognized expert on a wide range of energy policy issues with deep relationships across the industry. She earned a Master in Public Policy degree from the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University and a B.A., magna cum laude, from Williams College.

Jacqueline DeRosa is currently the Vice President of Energy Storage Systems at Ameresco where she strategically drives energy storage project development opportunities. She has over 20 years of experience in the US and international energy industry. Jacqueline's career has focused on both policy and regulatory reform, consulting, and commercial project development.

She is an expert in translating where rule changes are required to move projects into construction and commercial operation to ensure a reliable and resilient power grid in California.

Jacqueline is a well-known leader in the energy storage arena. She is in her second term as an elected Executive Board member of the national Energy Storage Association. In this role, she recently initiated and presented the new annual ESA Diversity and Inclusion award.

Before Ameresco, Ms. DeRosa was Vice President for Emerging Technologies at Customized Energy Solutions, where she advised clients on changing market rules and led nation-wide efforts to change the market rules to fairly integrate new technologies. Jacqueline worked for the California ISO in the energy policy, market design and account management areas. She has also worked on international energy sector restructuring matters for the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), and as a project developer for an independent power producer. She began her career at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. She has a B.A. from Rutgers University and an M.B.A. from George Washington University.



Janice Lin is the Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Strategen and the Founder and President of the Green Hydrogen Coalition. Janice has over 25 years of strategy experience and has distinguished herself as a leading clean energy changemaker. Janice co-founded and for a decade served as Executive Director of the California Energy Storage Alliance, where she helped create the world's most robust energy storage market. Janice is an internationally recognized thought leader in energy storage and grid decarbonization and won the 2019 Cleanie Award for Entrepreneur of the Year. In 2019 Janice launched the Green Hydrogen Coalition, an educational non-profit dedicated to facilitating policies and

practices to advance the production and use of green hydrogen in all sectors where it will accelerate the transition to a carbon free energy system.

Janice holds an MBA from the Stanford Graduate School of Business, a BS from the Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania, and a BA in International Relations from the University of Pennsylvania's College of Arts and Sciences.



Dr. Jeffrey Goldmeer is an Emerging Technologies Director at GE Gas Power. Jeff is responsible for developing and executing strategies for the decarbonization of gas turbine-based power plants. His primary focus is on the use of hydrogen as a zero-carbon power generation fuel, supporting GE's vision of accelerating decarbonization with gas turbine technology. He is co-creator and co-host of GE's new podcast, Cutting Carbon.

Jeff brings more than 19 years of experience in the energy industry. Prior to his current role, Jeff was the Director of

Gas Turbine Fuel & Combustion Solutions for GE Gas Power, and before that he was the Manager of the Combustion Lab at GE's Global Research Center. Notable achievements include multiple commercial power projects that represent first of a kind fuel usage, including hydrogen blending in F-class turbines with dry low NOx combustion systems, operation of a HA gas turbine on a blend of ethane and natural gas, as well as investigations on combustion acoustics and novel propulsion systems. Jeff has 12 patents on a variety of combustion and propulsion system technologies.

Jeff is a global industry speaker who has been recognized as providing technical leadership in the use of alternative fuels for power generation. His 2014 paper on the use of Arabian Super Light crude oil as a power generation fuel for F-class gas turbines in Saudi Arabia was recognized with the best paper award at PowerGen International.

Prior to joining GE, Jeff was a Senior Research Scientist at Southwest Sciences, and a National Research Council Research Associate at the NASA Glenn Research Center. His research focused on the development of new laser and optical based combustion diagnostics.

Dr. Goldmeer received his Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering from Case Western Reserve University and his B.S. in Mechanical Engineering from Worcester Polytechnic Institute. His Ph.D. dissertation research at NASA focused on extinguishing fires in a low-gravity environment. As part of his research, Jeff performed these experiments onboard NASA's Reduced Gravity Lab (aka the vomit comet).
