Emergency procurement delegation

Current delegation and procedures

- Procurement without observance of provisions requiring contracts, bids or public notice
- Advise CEO & GM and Chief Legal Officer immediately
- CEO & GM reports action to Board at earliest practical date (memo)
- Emergency procurement contract must involve; power restoration, public safety, or loss of generation conditions
- CEO & GM emergency procurement delegation limit is currently \$1M



History of emergency procurement use

In the past 5 years

3

- 14 emergency procurement actions;
- 7 were in 2017 related to subsidence (UARP and GPO)
- 3 were in 2020 related to COVID response
- 4 remaining 2019 through 2021 for pole replacement services



Justification to increase delegation

Construction market conditions

- In the past 2 years we have had two contractors cease work unexpectedly for key construction activities
- Cost of construction services can be up to \$1M per month
- Highly competitive amongst local contractors and sub contractors
- Our volumes of work call for higher levels of production and larger regional or national contractors, we have not been able to establish a key long-term strategic partnership to date

Increase emergency procurement delegation from \$1M to \$2M
