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1	(Meeting commenced at 6:05 p.m.)
2	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: All right. Thank you.
3	So Item No. 1 on tonight's agenda is conduct a
4	public hearing to consider two new federal standards in
5	accordance with the Public Utility Regulatory Policies
6	Act of 1978, or PURPA, as amended by the Infrastructure
7	Investment and Jobs Act of 2021, Demand-Response
8	Practices and Electric Vehicle Charging Programs.
9	All right. The public hearing will be
10	transcribed by a court reporter.
11	At this time I would like to open the public
12	hearing.
13	For taking public comment, there will be a
14	staff presentation. I would ask speakers to combine
15	your comments to the PURPA item. If you have comments
16	on other SMUD matters, you will have the opportunity to
17	speak when the agenda item is called or during the
18	general public comment portion of the agenda.
19	DIRECTOR ROSE: All right. We have Andrew
20	Meditz our senior attorney.
21	MR. MEDITZ: Good evening there we go.
22	Good evening, Board Members. Thanks for
23	having me. Again, Andrew Meditz. I'm a senior
24	attorney in the legal department.
25	And tonight and tonight I'm going to

1	talk about a federal compliance requirement under the
2	Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978.
3	Just a little background first. So PURPA wa

adopted in the wake of the oil crisis in the '70s, and it's really intended to promote conservation and efficiency in the electric industry.

Title I of PURPA are called Retail Regulatory Policies for Electric Utilities. They're commonly referred to as "Shall Consider Standards." And SMUD is a covered utility under PURPA, and therefore our Board has to consider these Retail Regulatory Policies as they pop up. And just to be clear, the Board has to consider but there is no actual requirement to adopt the standard.

Congress periodically adds new standards to PURPA, which is what they did in 2021 with the Infrastructure Investment Jobs Act, and that added the 20th and 21st of the Shall Consider Standards.

The first one is on Demand-Response Practices which encourages utilities to promote the use of Demand Response by customers to reduce electricity consumption during periods of high demand; and the second one is on Electric Vehicle Charging Programs which encourages utilities to promote greater electrification of the transportation sector.

1	So there is a few administerial process
2	requirements under PURPA that we have to comply with.
3	It's really a two-step process. SMUD and the Board
4	commenced consideration on October 20th of 2022 last
5	year, and now the second step is to complete
6	consideration and determination and make a
7	determination by November 15th, 2023. So under the
8	second step there must be a noticed hearing with
9	opportunity for public comment, which is what we're
LO	having tonight here, and in the next couple slides I'll
L1	briefly cover the Staff Reports which go into detail
L2	about all SMUD is doing around Demand Response and
L3	Electric Vehicles, and it includes proposed findings
L 4	for the Board's consideration.
L5	These Staff Reports are included in the Board
L6	packet, and they were also posted on SMUD.org last week
L7	for the public to review.
L8	The Board must make a determination whether to
L9	adopt the standards or not, which will occur at
20	tomorrow's board meeting, after the hearing tonight of
21	course. And then lastly the written determination must
22	be made available to the public, which we'll do by
23	posting on SMUD.org after tomorrow's meeting.
24	Now, jumping to the Staff Report. So Staff
25	developed a detailed Staff Report and Findings on the

1	Demand-Response Practices Standard. This slide
2	highlights a few of the programs initiatives and rates
3	that SMUD has to promote Demand Response.
4	And there is also a detailed staff report that
5	covers all we're doing around EV charging programs, and
6	this slide highlights, you know, programs, initiatives
7	and rates as well that we have in place that promote
8	electrification of transportation.
9	So with that, the recommendation is for the
10	Board to adopt the proposed findings in the Staff
11	Report and find that the ER and the EV federal
12	standards under PURPA are appropriate for use by SMUD.
13	And that's all I have, and I'm happy to answer
14	any questions if you have any.
15	MR. SCHOFIELD: Any questions?
16	DIRECTOR ROSE: I don't have any.
17	MR. SCHOFIELD: Okay.
18	DIRECTOR ROSE: But do you need anything from
19	us?
20	MR. MEDITZ: Yeah, just go on the consent
21	calendar and that will be the Board's determination to
22	comply with PURPA.
23	DIRECTOR ROSE: Perfect. Thank you for
24	that.
25	MR. MEDITZ: Thank you.

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1	DIRECTOR ROSE: Do we have any public comment?
2	We do not.
3	We don't seem to have anybody raising their
4	hand virtually either.
5	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Anybody else?
6	MR. SCHOFIELD: Do we need to close the
7	hearing then?
8	DIRECTOR ROSE: We do.
9	MR. SCHOFIELD: Okay. Then we will officially
10	close the hearing. The consent will be put on the
11	agenda. Thank you.
