

Plant trees for pollinators

Pollinators like bees, birds, bats and butterflies are some of the many creatures responsible for bringing us one out of every three bites of food we take, so if you like coffee, almonds, chocolate or honey, thank a pollinator. The problem is that pollinator populations are declining, and many are at risk due to sprawling development, habitat loss, climate change and pesticide use.

You can help support pollinators by planting the flowers, shrubs and trees they love. And SMUD can help. For 30 years, SMUD has partnered with the Sacramento Tree Foundation (Sac Tree) and planted more than 600,000 shade trees in the Sacramento area. The free trees we offer include many flowering species that attract pollinators.
