The special meeting of the Commissioners of the Sacramento Municipal Utility District Financing Authority (SFA) was held simultaneously in the Auditorium of the Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) Headquarters Building at 6201 S Street, Sacramento, and via virtual meeting (online) at 7:34 p.m.

Present also were Paul Lau, Chief Executive Officer and General Manager; Laura Lewis, Chief Legal & Government Affairs Officer and General Counsel; members of SMUD's executive management; and SMUD employees and visitors.

At the request of President Fishman, Ms. Lewis briefly reviewed the purpose, organization and responsibilities of the SFA, which currently owns and operates the Cosumnes Power Plant, the Campbell Power Plant, the McClellan Power Plant, the Carson Power Plant, and the Procter & Gamble Power Plant.

President Fishman called for approval of the agenda. Commissioner Kerth moved for approval of the agenda, Commissioner Herber seconded, and the agenda was unanimously approved.

President Fishman called for statements from visitors for items on the agenda, but none were forthcoming.

RESOLUTION NO. 25-SFA-06-01

WHEREAS, the Sacramento Municipal Utility District Financing
Authority (SFA) owns the Cosumnes Power Plant, the Carson Power Plant, the
Procter & Gamble Power Plant, the Campbell Power Plant, and the McCellan
Power Plant (collectively, the Plants); and

WHEREAS, SFA has, with the Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD), paid to defease all outstanding municipal bonds for the Plants; and

WHEREAS, the sole purpose of the Plants is to support SMUD's power generation requirements, SMUD is the foundational interested party in the Plants, and SFA has no legal or operational need to continue owning the Plants; and

WHEREAS, transferring these power generation assets to SMUD will not entail a change in the operation and maintenance or the operating conditions of the assets, and will not, therefore, have the potential to cause a significant impact on the environment; and

WHEREAS, transferring the assets and obligations of SFA, including ownership of the Plants to SMUD will allow for labor and administrative efficiencies and result in annual savings; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE SACRAMENTO MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT FINANCING AUTHORITY:

That this Commission hereby authorizes the Chief Executive Officer and General Manager, or his designee, to prepare and/or negotiate and execute any and all contracts and documents necessary to effectuate the transfer of assets and obligations of the Sacramento Municipal Utility District Financing Authority, including



ownership of the Cosumnes Power Plant, the Carson Power Plant, the Procter & Gamble Power Plant, the Campbell Power Plant, and the McClellan Power Plant, to the Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD).

Authorize the Chief Executive Officer and General Manager to negotiate and award four contracts to EthosEnergy Power Plant Services, LLC, to provide thermal plant operations and maintenance services for i) Cosumnes Power Plant, ii) Campbell and McCellan Power Plants, iii) Carson Power Plant, and iv) Procter & Gamble Power Plant (collectively, the "Contracts") for an approximate five-year period from October 15, 2025, to December 31, 2030, with an option to extend the operations and maintenance period for an additional five years, for a total aggregate not-to-exceed amount of \$303,810,611 for the Contracts.

Summary:

Request for Proposals No. Doc4998430728 (RFP) was issued in January 2025 to solicit third-party contractors to provide full-scope Operation & Maintenance Services for SMUD's thermal assets at Campbell, Carson, Cosumnes, Procter & Gamble, and McClellan Power Plants. A pre-proposal conference and job-walk was held on February 26, 2025, which resulted in eight vendor representatives attending. SMUD received three (3) proposals on March 28, 2025. After a thorough review of the proposals based on the technical scores and competitive pricing, EthosEnergy Power Plant Services, LLC (EthosEnergy) and NAES Corporation were invited to make short list presentations at SMUD's East Campus Operations Center office location. After the presentations and clarifying questions, EthosEnergy was confirmed as the highest rated responsive proposer.

WHEREAS, in January 2025, SMUD issued Request for Proposal No. Doc4998430728 (RFP) to solicit qualified contractors to provide full-scope Operation & Maintenance Services for SMUD's thermal assets at i) Cosumnes Power Plant, ii) Campbell and McClellan Power Plants, iii) Carson Power Plant, and iv) Procter & Gamble Power Plant for a five-year period, with an option to extend for an additional five years; and

WHEREAS, three proposals submitted in response to the RFP were evaluated; **NOW**, **THEREFORE**,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE SACRAMENTO MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT FINANCING AUTHORITY:

Section 1. As a result of such examination, EthosEnergy Power

Plant Services, LLC (EthosEnergy) is hereby determined and declared to the
highest evaluated responsive proposer to provide full-scope Operation &

Maintenance Services for SMUD's thermal assets at Campbell, Carson,

Cosumnes, Procter & Gamble, and McClellan Power Plants.

Section 2. The Chief Executive Officer and General Manager, or his designee, is authorized, on behalf of Sacramento Municipal Utility District Financing Authority (SFA), to negotiate and award four contracts to the highest evaluated responsive proposer, EthosEnergy, to provide thermal plant operations and maintenance services for i) Cosumnes Power Plant, ii) Campbell and McClellan Power Plants, iii) Carson Power Plant, and iv) Procter & Gamble Power Plant (collectively, the "Contracts") for an approximate five-year period



from October 15, 2025, to December 31, 2030, with an option to extend the operations and maintenance period for an additional five years, for a total aggregate not-to-exceed amount of \$303,810,611 for the Contracts.

Section 3. The Chief Executive Officer and General Manager, or his designee, is authorized to make future changes to the terms and conditions of the Contracts that, in his prudent judgment: (a) further the primary purpose of the Contracts; (b) is intended to provide a net benefit to SFA; and (c) does not exceed the authorized amount and applicable contingencies.
