Save money and energy this summer

Summer rates are June 1 through Sept. 30 and peak hours are from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. One of the biggest ways to save all summer long without sacrificing comfort is to reduce your usage during peak hours. That's when electricity costs the most. You can also save by shifting your usage to mid and off-peak hours, which are before 5 p.m. and after 8 p.m. All hours on weekends and holidays are at the lowest off-peak price. Here are some tips to help you save:

- Air conditioners are the biggest energy user.
 Stay comfortable and help the environment by reducing your air conditioner usage from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.
- Try setting your thermostat to 78 degrees or higher. For every 2 degrees that you turn your thermostat up, you can save 5-10% on cooling costs. Make this easier with a programmable or smart thermostat.
- Use fans instead of central air conditioning

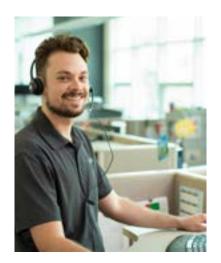
- whenever possible. A fan costs about 90% less to operate.
- Close blinds on windows that get direct sun.
- Change your air filter regularly. An air conditioning unit with dirty filters can use 5-10% more energy.
- If your home cools easily and can maintain a consistent temperature, try precooling your home to keep it comfortable between 5 p.m. and 8 p.m.
